Come and get a peek inside some of Albany's historic homes and buildings Saturday, July 30, on the 2022 Summer Interior Tour of Historic Homes, the first interior summer tour since 2019.

Since then, the Summer Tours have been exterior events, with homeowners decorating their porches and yards and some offering photos and video of their interiors, and many of the activities associated with the event had been curtailed because of Covid 19 restrictions.

Not this time. The tour will be held from 11 am to 5 pm, and several homes, a downtown loft and other historic buildings will be open for visitors. Don't forget to stop off at the Albany Regional Museum for some light refreshments as you take the tour, the 43rd consecutive year the event has been held.

This tour is self-guided; you can visit the homes in any order. Some of the homes are within walking distance of each other or you can drive your car.

Tickets will be available online at monteithhouse.org from Monday, July 11 until noon on Friday, July 29, and may be picked up the day of the tour. A lim-

ited number will be available on the day of the tour beginning at 10 am at the Albany Visitors Association, 110 3rd Ave. SE, for cash/check only. The cost is \$15 per person. Well-behaved children under 12 are admitted free with a paid adult. Proceeds benefit the Monteith House Museum.



Participating historic homes and buildings throughout the Monteith, Hackleman and Downtown Commercial Districts will open their doors to tour participants. Meet the owners and learn about the architecture, the original occupants and the ins and outs of restoring historic structures. Please respect the homeowners' wishes regarding any social distancing or mask requirements.
