Bids Open for Wells Fargo Demolition

The fate of the former Downtown Albany Wells Fargo Bank appears to be sealed. An invitation to bid for the demolition of the 10.948 square-foot structure at 300 West First Street, the adjacent carport, drive-through area, and related work was issued by the City of Albany on October 17, 2022.

A mandatory pre-bid meeting and site visit was held on October 25. Over a dozen contractors attended.

The due date for bids is Tuesday, November 15. Once the bids are in, the Albany Revitalization Agency will meet on Nov 16 and likely award a contract.

The invitation states the project is to be complete by June 30, 2023. The ARA looks forward to when this lot can be repurposed into an active use for the community and fitting with downtown.
