The OMS Revitalization Grant application must be submitted by the Albany Downtown Association on the member's behalf. Only one applicant will be submitted for Albany for the 2023 grant cycle.

To help the ADA grant committee in selecting the project most in keeping with the grant mission and highest likelihood of winning an award and to ensure that the interested Albany Downtown Association member is properly prepared for the Oregon Main Street Application process, we are again requiring a "pre-application."

Pre-applications will be reviewed and follow -up questions made by the Albany Downtown Association Grant Committee to make our final project selection. Once a project is selected, we will work together to complete the official SHPO grant application.

In 2015, legislation established a permanent fund for the grant and provided an initial \$2.5 million of funding as part of a larger lottery bond package. In the 2017 legislative session, an additional \$5 million was approved and was funded through the sale of the 2019 lottery bond package.



The 2021 bond sale was canceled due to the economic impact of COVID-19, but the Oregon legislature included Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant in the bond packages slated for 2022 and 2023.

In 2022, the third grant cycle, SHPO awarded 28 matching grants worth \$5,000,000 to Oregon Main Street Network organizations across the state for building projects that encourage economic vitality. The projects brought in a total matching investment of \$6,083,421 to Oregon downtowns .

ADA's grant application committee looks forward to reading through the applications to find the best partner and project.



Revitalization Grant Opportunity Returns for 2023

We are very excited to share that the Albany Downtown Association has launched our preapplication process to find a member project as our submission for the 2023 Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant!

Like last year, this statewide grant is open for downtown revitalization efforts in communities participating in the Oregon Main Street Network including Historic Downtown Albany.



Albany Downtown Association's project to restore the Oregon Electric Railway Station, and move Sybaris Bistro was among 28 projects selected in 2022. We hope to find a competitive project and be awarded a grant for Downtown Albany again this year.

The Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant is a competitive grant offered by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) for up to \$200,000. Matching funds of at least 30% of the award is required. Matching funds can be in the form of cash, in-kind donations, and/or volunteer time.

The Revitalization Grant funds may be used to acquire, rehabilitate and construct buildings on properties. Funded projects must facilitate community revitalization that will lead to private investment, job creation or retention, establishing or expanding viable businesses or creating a stronger tax base. Projects may include façade improvement, accessibility enhancement, basic utilities, second floor renovations and more.

Albany's OER Station project fills a well-defined need and met so many of the criteria including strong public outpouring, partner

support and the city's endorsement. Having a strong historic vision, skilled team and the ability to complete the project following all Secretary of the Interior Standards on time are also key.


Working capital is also needed as the grant is on a reimbursement basis, typically quarterly.

Gallery Calapooia "Big Show of Little Art" Call for Artists

Annually, the members of Gallery Calapooia invite the community to come show their art. The criteria is pretty simple - anyone can show, any medium can be shown. The major thing is that the work



must not be larger than 8 inches by 8 inches for flat work and 8 x 8 x 8 inches for three-dimensional work.

"All are welcome to participate: new artists who are showing their work for the first time, veteran artists who have been showing their work for years, and artists of all ages, the young and the old," said Pat Spark, Gallery Calapooia artist and spokesperson.

The 8 x 8 exhibit celebrates the community and community arts. All artwork must be for sale and cannot have been shown in previous Gallery Calapooia exhibits.

All wall art must be exactly 8 x 8. Canvasses and other supplies are available at The Frame House, 434 W 1st Ave. W.

Entries are due Sunday, Jan. 22. Artwork must be hand-delivered with an entry form to Gallery Calapooia at 222 1st Ave. W in Downtown Albany between 10 am-6 pm.

Entry forms can be found at the Gallery, The Frame House or online. There is a limit of one entry per artist.

"The space for the exhibition is small and we will endeavor to accept as many artists' works as we can. We have room for approximately 110 entries depending on the number of 2D and 3D entries," added Linda.

The artists' reception will be Friday, Feb. 3 from 6-8 pm at Gallery Calapooia. The exhibit runs Jan. 31-Feb. 25.
