

Downtown Albany has lots to offer every day of the week. Want to visit on a Monday? Here are 18 restaurants and cafes ready to serve you!

Modern comfort food and a cozy diner vibe make Brick & Mortar a beloved spot for breakfast and lunch in the heart of downtown. From fluffy omelets and crepes to hearty burgers and the must-try Biscuit Sandwich, every bite feels like home.

This lively brewpub and distillery offers craft beer, cocktails and casual bites in a relaxed setting with atrium dining, darts and live music. Burgers, sandwiches and the Calapooia Chili Beer are go-to favorites for a laid-back meal with friends.



Take in the view of Albany's beloved carousel while sampling kid-friendly bites and nostalgic snacks. Grab a corn dog or mac and cheese, then top it off with a slushie, shake or old-fashioned ice cream float.

Spacious and welcoming, Deluxe Brewing is a top spot to enjoy locally brewed lagers and small-batch spirits. Their tasting room features food truck fare and guest favorites like Wild Beaver Amber Lager and the award-winning New Albany Gin.

A longtime Albany staple, The Depot serves fish 'n chips, chowder and fried seafood in generous portions with a no-frills, all-flavor approach. Regulars rave about the Bonnie Shrimp Crunch Salad, fish tacos and Northwest oysters.

With 46 taps and plenty of events, The Garage is a go-to for pub fare, craft beverages and entertainment. Enjoy burgers, beer flights and rotating specials in a space that features trivia, sports and community hangouts.

A forest-themed interior and locally



foraged ingredients set this charcuterie spot apart. Dishes like their signature Seared Salmon or tasty Wild Boar Ragu pair perfectly with their elevated wines and creative cocktails like the Ghost of the Forest Old Fashioned.

A beloved drive-thru with retro charm, Hasty Freez offers old-school burgers, corn dogs, shakes and soft-serve ice cream. Standouts include the Burger Box, blackberry sundae and colorful slushy floats that keep locals and visitors coming back time after time.

Southern comfort shines at Jo Jo Mac's, where the menu is full of flavor and hospitality. From beignets and benedicts to gumbo and shrimp & grits, it's a crowd-pleasing spot for hearty breakfasts and bold bites.



Serving bold Asian flavors in a casual setting, K Teriyaki is known for grilled meats, flavorful sauces, and generous portions. Customer favorites include bento boxes, combo platters, and savory seaweed salad with crisp tempura sides.

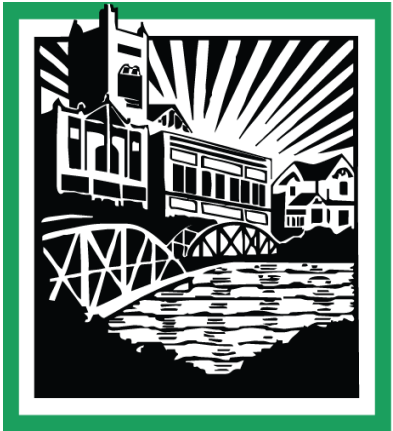

ADA Awarded OMS Revitalization Grant for ACT Project

We are excited to announce ADA was awarded an Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant in the amount of \$400,000 to partner with Albany Civic Theater to rehabilitate the facades and complete specific interior repairs at the Rialto Theater and the McAlphin's Confectionery building. The project includes a match of \$279,626 in volunteer hours, in-kind donations and cash. Work will begin this month and be completed in early 2028.

Oregon Heritage, a division of Oregon Parks and Recreation Department, awarded 35 matching grants worth over \$10,600,000 to OMS Network organizations across the state. The program is funded by Lottery Bonds.
