More Customer Parking Available

On February 23, Albany City Council approved a proposal presented by Ron Irish, Transportation Systems Analyst, on behalf of the ParkWise Advisory Board to adjust times on 27 street parking spaces in Downtown.

Most 10-minute zones are being removed including those in front of the Old Wells Fargo and banks along Ellsworth and Lyon. Some customer spaces will be 30-minutes while others are set to be 3-hour and All Day. All Day spaces are also available to employees and residents with a valid ParkWise permit. There were five additional spaces added where there were formerly loading zones.

Please watch for the new parking sign starting on March 14 and through the spring.

Albany Waterfront Construction to Begin in Summer 2022

According to an update at the February 26 meeting of the Albany Revitalization Agency (ARA), construction of the Albany Waterfront Project will begin this summer with Phase 1. This phase includes railroad crossings, utilities and parking lot improvements by Albany Civic Theater.

Phase 1 lays the groundwork for Phase 2 and includes inground infrastructure and upgrades to a parking lot. Phase 2 will bring dramatic changes to Monteith Riverpark and a 3 block span to the east along Water Avenue. Phase 2 work is set for summer 2023 and includes the new stage, playground and splash pad.

Phase 1 Scope:

- One city block from Ellsworth to Lyon
- (4) Improved rail crossings at Lyon St., Montgomery St., Thurston St. and a private crossing by Lafayette St.
- (2) Closed rail crossings at Ellsworth St. and Baker St.
- Parking lot improvements between Ellsworth and Lyon St.
- Water line project
- Undergrouding utilities

Phase 2 Scope:

- General park improvements
- New stage


- New playground and splash pad
- Entrance Plaza
- Renovated piers
- Riparian restoration along Dave Clark Trail
- (3) blocks of Plaza Street
- (5) Railroad crossing improvements
- Undergrounding utilities
- (X) Remaining blocks of Greetstreet upon available funding

Sybaris' OER Station Project Selected to Compete for Grant

The Albany Downtown Association recently selected Sybaris Bistro as our partner to apply for the 2022 Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant (OMSRG).

The project will save a deteriorating historic landmark, bringing the Oregon Electric Railway Station back to its former glory as a gateway to the heart of Downtown Albany.

Plans will include stabilizing brick walls, making roof repairs and addressing other key issues. An important upgrade is making the building handicap accessible.

Beyond the grant, the overall vision includes preserving the trees, landscaping the blighted corner and creating an outside dining space. This project will also create new jobs through expanded seating in the new restaurant space. This is a big plus for the Hackleman District.

Once selected, Matt and Janel Bennett, Sybaris' owners, spent four weeks working with the ADA grant team, contractors, advisors and community volunteers to prepare Albany's OMSRG application. Fourteen letters of support were submitted including ones from Mayor Alex Johnson II and Linn County Commissioner Roger Nyquist.

"There was an excellent variety of very worthy projects submitted," said Lise Grato, ADA's Executive Director. "We wish we could partner with each of them for this grant, but Albany can only select one project to submit for statewide consideration."

The selection committee was comprised of ADA board members, committee members and community partners.

"An extremely hard decision was made over the course of three lengthy meetings and dozens of additional hours of independent research and study by committee members," added Grato.

The OMSRG is a competitive grant offered by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) for up to \$200,000 in matching funds for downtown revitaliza-



tion efforts in communities participating in the Oregon Main Street Network such as Historic Downtown Albany. The application was submitted on March 15. The winners will be announced on May 12.

In 2019, the last time this grant was offered, only 63% of the projects submitted from across Oregon were awarded. Albany Downtown Association hopes this project will be among those chosen for 2022.

There are other SHPO grants available, and ADA will work with Downtown building owners to create competitive applications for those later this spring.

Albany Downtown Association, celebrating its 40th year, is a "Performing Main Street" level community, one of just 8 statewide to maintain this status. There are a total of 66 member Main Streets statewide and 1,200 across the country.

2022 Albany Taps & Caps a Success


